A SHOUT OUT FOR CAMP OUTS

Our area camp outs made a huge difference in my early sobriety. At first, I was hesitant. After all, who wants to go spend a sweaty weekend with a bunch of near strangers? And without beer?

When I arrived at my first one, I was appalled that all the tents were so close together. I tried to put my tent as far away from the others as possible. But you guys didn't let me isolate like that. I was greeted, invited to sit by the fire and treated like a part of the family. Until then, I hadn't realized that I *was* part of a family.

The weekend turned out to be magical. It was life changing, live saving. I went to every camp out that I could that summer. Long talks with sober people, meetings around the fire, and just getting to see how this program works in real life gave me hope. I saw that there was life after drinking, AND that it could be a good life, better than life was before.

That first summer I met people who have become lifetime friends. That was 22 years ago, and I'm still excited for camp out season. If you know a newcomer, invite them to a camp out. If you are a newcomer, go to one. It might change your life.
